WIC SERVES

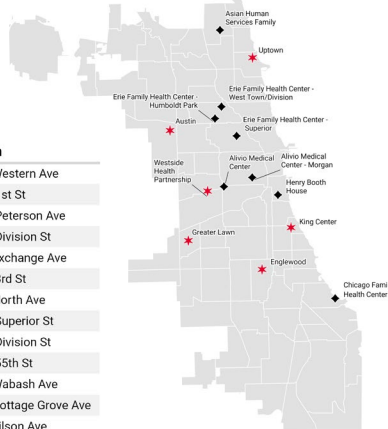
Pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to age five who:

- Have a household income at or below 185% of the poverty level
- Have at least one documented nutritional risk
