





COVID HOSPITALIZATION rates remain higher among unvaccinated Chicagoans compared to fully vaccinated Chicagoans







CITYWIDE PROGRESS TOWARDS 77%






Percent of residents 12+ years-old with at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine by community area



Citywide: 72.9%





Congratulations to the following neighborhoods for reaching important milestones in PC77

Over the past week:

- Austin, Avalon Park, and Grand Boulevard reached 60% in 1st dose vaccine coverage (ages 12+)
- Humboldt Park reached 70% in 1st dose vaccine coverage (ages 12+)
- Brighton Park reached 77% in 1st dose vaccine coverage (ages 12+)
- East Garfield Park had the biggest increase in 1st dose vaccine coverage (ages 12+)





COVID-19 case rate remains low in Chicago Public Schools

Since the start of the school year:

Total of 0.46% (4-5 out of every 1,000) **CPS staff and students have:**

- A) had a positive COVID-19 test and
- B) been present at a CPS facility during the time they may have been infectious (starting two days before their symptom onset or positive test)

In the last two weeks:

Total of 0.19% (approximately 2 out of every 1000 staff and students)

Students include only students in district-run schools (excluding charter and contract schools). All staff, including citywide, network, and central staff, are included. Actionable cases include individuals who were in a CPS building during their infectious period. Non-actionable cases are not included in this calculation. Cases are self-reported and assigned to the date they were reported. Data from school year 2021-22 are included. Data is from CPS public dashboard, October 3, 2021.



CPS screening COVID-19 testing (for people WITHOUT symptoms)



Last week's screening test results (9/26-10/2)

- 25 positive tests out of 11,524 valid screening COVID-19 tests across more than 500 schools
- 0.21% positive (2 out of every 1000 tests performed)

Cumulative screening test results (8/29-10/4)

- 39 positive tests out of 21,767 valid screening COVID-19 tests
- 0.18% positive (2 out of every 1000 tests performed)
- In line with expected positivity rates and lower than in many other school districts; no signs of unrecognized spread
- Will work to ensure screening of unvaccinated persons is prioritized, while continuing to promote vaccination

Reminder: CDC Booster guidance (Pfizer only)

SHOULD RECEIVE BOOSTER

- People 65+ and long-term-care facility residents SHOULD receive... a Pfizer booster at least 6 months after their Pfizer primary vaccine series. Benefit/risk balance is most favorable for adults >65 years.
- People 50-64 with underlying medical conditions SHOULD receive...

MAY RECEIVE BOOSTER

- People 18-49 with underlying medical conditions MAY receive...
- People 18-64 who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting MAY receive...

Moderna and J and J boosters expected be evaluated "in the coming weeks, to swiftly make additional recommendations"

For public health purposes (e.g. vaccination employment requirements, quarantine, etc), at this point people continue to be considered fully vaccinated when they have completed the *primary* series

The State of Illinois' eviction moratorium ended on October 3, 2021, but Chicago tenants still have financial and legal options to help them to remain in their homes

- 1. **Don't self-evict.** A notice of eviction from your landlord does not mean you need to leave your home right away. Only the Sheriff can legally remove you from your home.
- 2. **Get legal help.** Free legal assistance is available to Chicago renters. Go to Rentervention.com, which is provided by the Lawyers Committee for Better Housing, a DOH delegate agency.
- **3. Get financial help.** DOH maintains a current list of places residents can apply for emergency rental assistance at Chicago.gov/eviction.
