WIC plays a crucial role in improving family health and wellness, and reducing infant mortality, one of the primary drivers of Chicago's racial life expectancy gap.

WIC SERVES

Pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to age five who:

- Are residents of the State of Illinois
- Have a household income at or below 185% of the poverty level
- Have at least one documented nutritional risk
