**Commander response**: Over the next 6-12 months I will meet with you and review this program as a crime reduction strategy...lets discuss further offline.

**Neighbor #3:** What are you hearing from the ASA changes about retail thefts? There are spikes in crime around

**Commander response**: There is a difference in the way they are prosecuting, there has been an increase in the number of retail theft arrest/prosecutions. .... which is in alignment with 18<sup>th</sup> Districts Arrest efforts.
