# Key Updates - CPD Workforce Allocation Study

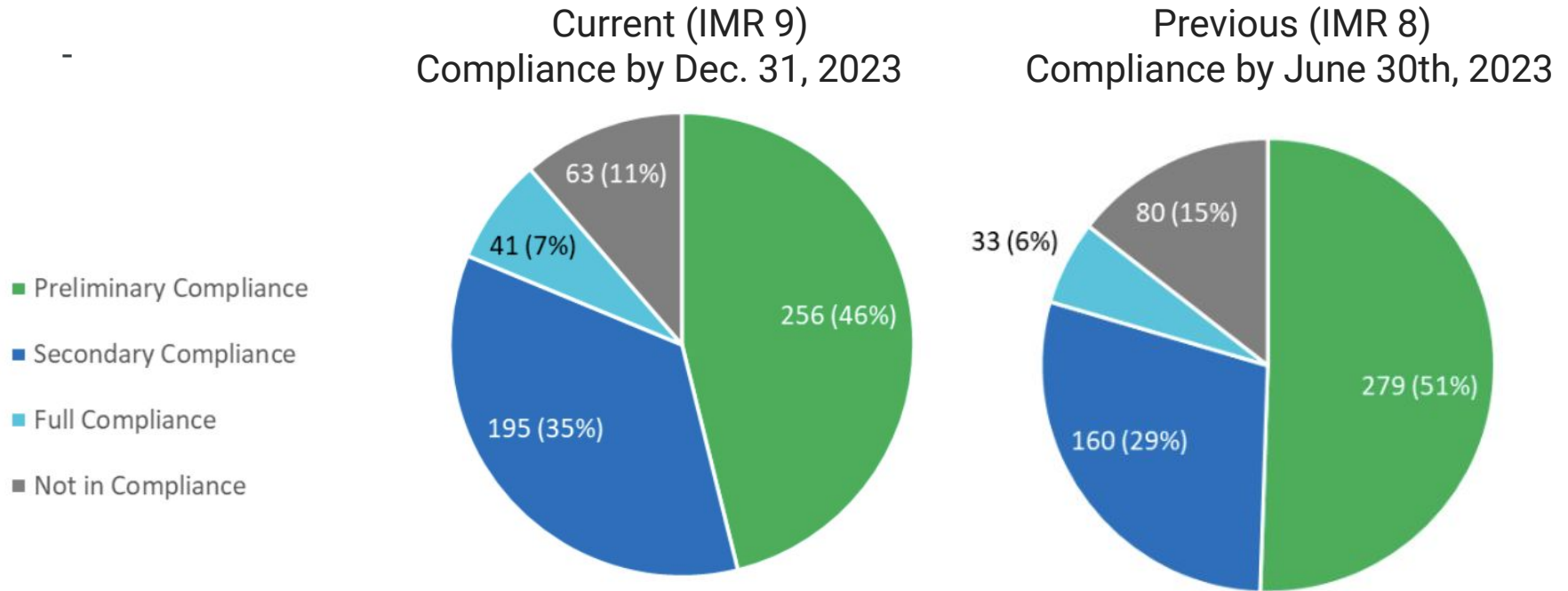
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Update via Ald. Matt Martin (47):

- CPD is has chosen a Third Party organization to conduct the Workforce Allocation (WFA) Study: [Matrix Consulting Group](#)
- The scope is near final. The City is waiting on the IL Attorney General's Office to confirm their support (requirement of the consent decree).
- Deadline to enter agreement is 6/18. City plans to meet this deadline.
- We're continuing to advocate our community's voice to be included in what the final Workforce Allocation Study will accomplish

# Key Updates - Independent Monitoring Report 9

## Sample of Principal Achievements:

- Report credits progress on the Workforce Allocation Study as “earnest progress towards addressing issues that are instrumental to sustained compliance and long-term success”
- New body worn camera policy created to help with transparency
- Improvements made to search warrant policy and procedure
- Worked to streamline progress on policies that will bolster constitutional policing during the DNC

# Key Updates - Independent Monitoring Report 9

## Sample of Principal Challenges:

- Little evidence that patrol officers are using community policing principles in their daily activities
- Staffing shortages across a variety of departments hamper progress
  - Crisis Intervention Unit have dropped by 50% since 2011
- 46.5% of all CIT Officers had their mental health training over 6 years ago and have not had any refresher courses since
- Need to address Suicide Prevention Initiatives and other efforts to ensure the mental health and well being of officers

# Key Updates - CCPSA Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee nominated fifteen candidates to Mayor Johnson on March 8, 2024.

Mayor Johnson named seven appointees.

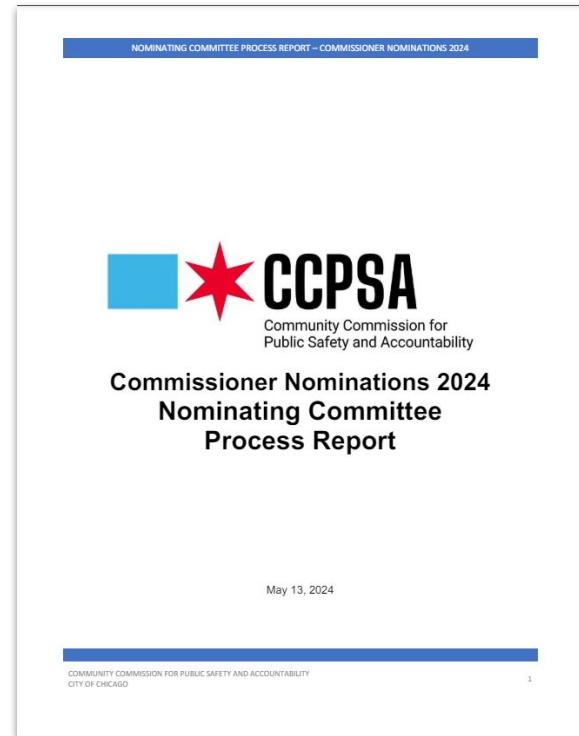
# Key Updates - CCPSA Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee released 50+ page Process Report on May 13, 2024. The report:

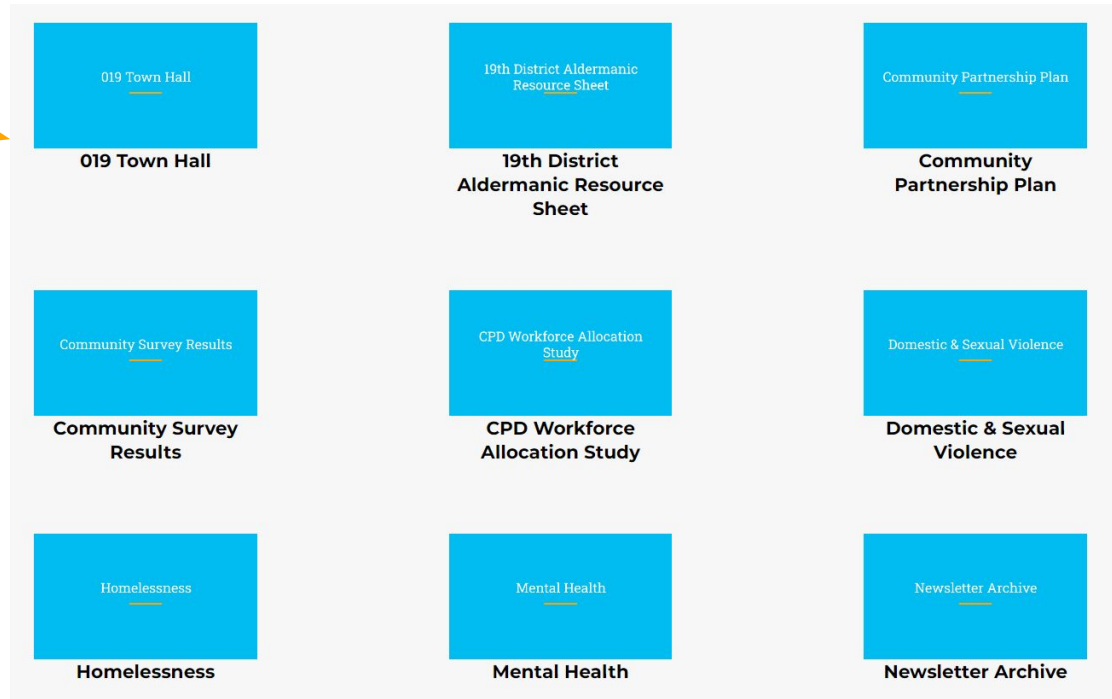
1. outlines the Committee's structure and practices to date

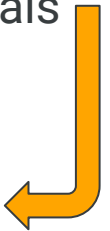


# Community Partnership Plan (CPP) Overview

We've prioritized **43 action items!** (so far)

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# Public Comment - Rules & Follow Up

## Rules of Engagement

- 2 min/speaker = ~10 speakers (typically 20 minutes total)
- Request to make public comment must be submitted within 30-minutes of start of meeting
- Order of speakers randomly selected
- No disruption of speakers
- No harassment or disrespect will be tolerated (zero tolerance policy)

## Follow Up

- Public comments are of utmost importance to DCMs
- DCMs and staff will take official minutes of public comments made
- DCMs may address comments in real time or may follow up with community member at a later time

**Register the Location of Your Private Camera. Help Solve Crime Faster.**



The City of Chicago has launched a free and voluntary camera registration program open to anyone who lives or operates a business in Chicago. If you have a private security camera that captures the public way and you are interested in assisting in an investigation in the event of a crime in your neighborhood, you can register your camera with the Chicago Police Department. By registering your camera, you are simply allowing the Chicago Police Department to contact you in the event of a crime in your area. The Chicago Police Department will not have direct access to your camera system and cannot access camera footage without your consent. There is no requirement to provide footage at any time.
