- DCMs may address comments in real time or may follow up with community member at a later time

- 12 Distribute 1,500 mental health palm cards to community members


## Key Call-Outs

Work with CAPS Sergeant to help dispel feelings of anxiety and fear by providing more context and explanation of incidents that occured in the beat. For example:

- Providing explanation of CPD terminology used in CAPS packets (ie. written explanation of robbery vs burglary vs theft)
- 25 Sharing number of violent crimes that have occured to people randomly on the street
  - Sharing tips on how to stay protected, all in one clear sheet
  - Ensuring CAPS packet being share with community are relevant and up-to-date
  - Providing information about the next District Council meeting and how to sign up to receive our newsletters
