Table 2. <u>Divvy Program and Expansion</u>: Electrification of stations – Kyle Peppin,
 CDOT

Chicago's Divvy bike share program is adding charging capabilities for devices at 100+ stations over the next 2.5 years. Charging stations reduce the need for battery swapping, which cuts emissions and ensures greater device availability. At this round table, Divvy team members will present on current and proposed charging stations locations, explain the purpose and qualification criteria, and elicit community feedback on electrification.

Table 3. <u>Safe Travel for All Plan:</u> Improving connectivity for people biking and walking – Joseph Seymour, Cook County Department of Transportation & Highways

This conversation will focus on how roadways can act as barriers for people walking, bicycling, and rolling in Chicago to reach everyday destinations, and will also discuss approaches and interventions to improve connectivity. Participants will be invited to share their experiences traveling and desire for greater connectivity in the Logan Square area and Chicago overall.
