Xylazine Fact Sheet

- Xylazine is not an opioid. It is a sedative that is intended for use in animals only.
- Xylazine is often mixed with other substances to increase their potency or volume, including heroin, cocaine, and pills. It can be swallowed, injected, snorted, or inhaled.
- Use of xylazine can cause sev re skin wounds anywhere on the body which may cause infection.
- Naloxone (Narcan) should always be given in a suspected overdose, but it cannot reverse a xylazine overdose.
- Signs of an overdose include: slow/shallow breathing, pale or blue skin, slowed heart rate, and falling asleep/lack of consciousness. Call 911 if you think someone is overdosing.
- To reduce risk of overdose: discard substances that test positive for xylazine, use with someone else present and always have naloxone (Narcan) available.
