



Numbers on the map represent the total number of accredited health departments and vital records and health statistics units in each state.



Brief History of CDPH PHAB Accreditation and Process

- Original Accreditation: 2013
 - CDPH was part of working group to identify domains and create process structure
- 1st Reaccreditation: 2018
 - 5-year cycle to Reaccreditation with the submission of annual reports every year
- 2nd Reaccreditation: 2024
 - Extra year added to cycle because of COVID, re-structured to 10 Domains





***** Why Reaccreditation?

- Accountability: maintain accountability through the Reaccreditation process.
- Continuous Improvement: drives ongoing evolution and improvement in public health practices.
- Effectiveness: encourages health departments to become increasingly effective in serving their community's health needs.

PHAB Accreditation does not cover:

- Individual patient care and clinical protocols governing provision of care to an individual.
- Administration of programs for reimbursement of healthcare services, such as Medicaid.
- Individual professional and facility licensure and certificate programs.
- Programs designed to improve health or wellbeing of animals.
