
CDPH works with communities and partners to create an equitable, safe, resilient and healthy Chicago.

Healthy Chicago is ... Vaccination



- 11,525 doses of updated 2024-25 flu vaccine administered to Chicagoans
- **9,392** doses of updated 2024-25 COVID-19 vaccine administered to Chicagoans
- 243 vaccination events supported city-wide

Healthy Chicago is ... Sexual Health



- 30,000+ HIV tests provided to at-risk individuals
- **27,777** sexual transmitted infection tests given to Chicagoans
- **8,300** people living with HIV received medical and supportive services
- 217 patients provided with antibiotics to prevent getting sexually transmitted infections
- 142 patients provided with medication preventing HIV infection
- 80 summits on sexual health and connections to care held across Chicago with 100+ participants each

Healthy Chicago is ... Violence Prevention

- **5,101** violent incidents mediated through street outreach
- 1,485 people enrolled/served via street outreach case management
- 18 community organizations partnering with CDPH on street outreach in high-violence Chicago neighborhoods

Healthy Chicago is ... Substance Use Prevention



- 23,889 units of Narcan® distributed through vending machines and public access points
- **3,572** Medication Assisted Recovery Now calls for opioid treatment fielded with callers referred for treatment
- 20% reduction in opioid-related emergency responses from 2023

Healthy Chicago is ... Tobacco Cessation

- **8,200** Chicagoans engaged in tobacco prevention and control
- 1,000 units of Nicotine Replacement Therapy distributed to local Federally Qualified Healthcare Centers
- 173 events held with community health workers promoting tobacco cessation resources on the South and West Sides

Healthy Chicago is ... Community Breast Health



- 45,000 women educated on the importance of breast health and cancer prevention
- 1,800 women provided access to mammograms
- **785** community outreach events informing women about breast cancer screening and treatment

Healthy Chicago is ... Emergency Preparedness



 1,000 emergency kits made & distributed with assistance of 20 community organizations

Healthy Chicago is ... Infectious Disease & Outbreak Response

- **4,213** infectious disease cases of public health significance reported to CDPH for surveillance and investigation
- 490 wastewater and clinical samples tested at public health laboratories for enhanced infectious disease surveillance
- 214 CDPH responses to disease outbreak initiated within 24 hours

Healthy Chicago is ... Food Protection



- 15,997 total food inspections completed
- 10,869 Chicago food establishments inspected
- **2,600**+ 311 food-related complaints resolved

Healthy Chicago is ... Air Quality

- 695 air pollution control tickets issued with 99% success rate
- 255 air permitted facilities inspected
- 97% of air pollution control permits were reviewed and completed within 14 days

Healthy Chicago is ... Mental Health



- **33,400**+ Chicagoans received services through CDPH clinics and funded partners
- **22,397** BIPOC clients served by the Mental Health Equity Initiative

Healthy Chicago is ... Supporting New Families



- 4,072 Family Connects nurse home visits completed
- **68%** of participating families received at least one referral for services

Healthy Chicago is ... Healthy Homes



- 37,921 children tested for elevated blood lead levels
- 1,093 children who tested with elevated blood lead levels received follow-up case management care from CDPH nurses
- 746 homes inspected for lead and other health hazards
- 115 homes received lead remediation or abatement for other health hazards
- 43% of the children who received follow-up care had blood levels fall below the action level within 6 months

Healthy Chicago is ... Community Health Care Success Stories

Supporting New Families

During a lactation support call, a nurse recognized a new mother needed urgent care. Recovering from a C-section, she was overwhelmed and had neglected her blood pressure medication. With a reading of 160/100, the nurse urged her to take her medication and go to the ER if needed. She was later admitted for postpartum pre-eclampsia, a serious but rare complication. At her Family Connects nurse follow-up visit, she tearfully thanked the nurse, believing the intervention saved her life.

Sexual Health

A 28-year-old new to Chicago visited a CDPH Sexual Health clinic for HIV and infection prevention care. She received a same-day medication refill, follow-up support, and unexpected help accessing gender-affirming care. Over three months, she received screenings, treatments, and medication management before transitioning to a partner clinic for long-term care and hormone therapy. On her last visit, she tearfully thanked the staff, saying she never wanted to leave. CDPH continues to check in, ensuring her ongoing health and support.

Vaccinations



Every Sunday, CDPH and two community partners offer free COVID and flu vaccines at the Swap-O-Rama flea market. This collaboration between Cimpar, Swap-O-Rama and CDPH brings essential care to a community heavily impacted by respiratory illness, offering a convenient, trusted space for those without adequate insurance. Since the program began, vaccines have been given weekly, helping to keep Chicago healthy.

As one of the biggest U.S. cities, Chicago must respond to public health challenges at the scope and scale of a state. CDPH leverages longstanding relationships with community, county, and state health partners to optimize resource and service allocation, break down programmatic silos, and prioritize communities most impacted by adverse health outcomes.

Chicago deserves sustained investment in disease prevention, health promotion and protection so that we can reduce premature mortality and strengthen the health of all Chicagoans.
