THE POLICE BOARD'S ROLE IN THE DISCIPLINARY PROCESS

Discharge Cases: The Police Board decides disciplinary cases when the Superintendent of Police files charges to discharge a sworn officer from the Chicago Police Department (CPD).

Disagreement Cases: Individual members of the Police Board rule on disagreements between the Chief Administrator of the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA) and the Superintendent of Police regarding the recommended discipline of an officer.
