1 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Good evening. We're
2 going to start the meeting. If you can take
3 your seats.

4 Good evening. I am Lori
5 Lightfoot, President of the Chicago Police
6 Board and calling the meeting to order.

7 Board members O'Malley and
8 Simpson are unable to attend the meeting in
9 person. Is there a motion to permit attendance
10 via audio conference?

11 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: So moved.

12 MR. EADDY: Second.

13 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

14 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

15 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?

16 (NO RESPONSE.)

17 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: The motion passes.

18 The first item of business is
19 approval of the minutes of the Board's regular
20 community meeting held on October 19. Is there
21 a motion to approve the minutes?

22 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: So moved.

23 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Second?

24 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Second.

1 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor?

2 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

3 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?

4 (NO RESPONSE.)

5 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Motion passes.

6 Our next regular public meeting
7 will be on Thursday, December 14th, at 7:30
8 p.m. here at Chicago Public Safety
9 Headquarters. Please note this meeting is on
10 the second Thursday of the month in deference
11 to the holidays.

12 At this time, I ask for a motion
13 to close a series of executive sessions for the
14 purposes of considering personnel matters and
15 litigation as authorized by Sections 2(c)(1),
16 (3), (4) and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings
17 Act. Is there such a motion?

18 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: So moved.

19 MS. DELGADO: Second.

20 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All those in favor?

21 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

22 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Opposed?

23 (NO RESPONSES.)

24 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: The motion passes.

1 A report of disciplinary actions
2 taken by the Board during the previous month
3 has been made available at this evening's
4 meeting. This report and the Board's written
5 findings and decisions are posted on the
6 Board's website.

7 The Police Board, as authorized
8 by the Open Meetings Act, has considered in a
9 closed meeting one disciplinary case. The
10 Board will now take final action on this.

11 Regarding case number 17 BP 2926,
12 is there a motion to find Police Officer Daniel
13 Smith not guilty of using deadly force without
14 justification?

15 MR. FLORES: So moved.

16 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Is there a second?

17 MR. SIMPSON: Second.

18 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

19 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

20 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?

21 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Opposed.

22 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Opposed.

23 Voting in favor are Board members
24 Flores, O'Malley and Simpson. Board Member

1 Eaddy and I oppose the motion. The motion
2 passes.

3 Is there a motion to adopt the
4 written findings and decisions and dissent that
5 has been reviewed by all members who
6 participated in the case?

7 BOARD MEMBER FLORES: So moved.

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Second?

9 BOARD MEMBER O'MALLEY: Second.

10 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

11 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

12 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?

13 (NO RESPONSE.)

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: The motion passes.

15 The Board's decision in the case
16 which we took final action this evening will be
17 entered as of today's date and will be issued
18 to the parties. A copy of the written decision
19 will be posted on the Board's website as
20 required by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

21 There is one additional matter to
22 announce. Board Member Flores will report on
23 this matter.

24 MR. FLORES: Thank you, President

1 Lightfoot.

2 Pursuant to Section 2-78-130 of
3 the Municipal Code of Chicago, I considered one
4 matter on which the Chief Administrator and the
5 Superintendent of Police did not agree
6 regarding the discipline of a police officer.
7 Case number 17 RR 07 involves allegations that
8 Police Officer Brandon Ternand used excessive
9 and unwarranted force when he shot Mr. Dakota
10 Bright.

11 The Chief Administrator
12 recommended sustaining the allegations and
13 discharging the officer from the Chicago Police
14 Department.

15 The Superintendent did not concur
16 with this recommendation, stating that the
17 officer's actions were justified.

18 After reviewing this matter, I
19 find that the Superintendent did not meet the
20 burden of overcoming the Chief Administrator's
21 recommendation for discipline; therefore, the
22 Chief Administrator's recommendation is deemed
23 accepted by the Superintendent.

24 A copy of the written opinion

1 will be posted on the Board's website as
2 required by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

3 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All right. The next
4 item, the general orders and other directives
5 issued by the Superintendent of Police during
6 the previous month are listed in the books and
7 available at this evening's meeting and are
8 posted on the Police Department's website.

9 The next item is the
10 Superintendent's report to the Board.

11 First, Deputy Navarro, is there
12 any report?

13 FIRST DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT NAVARRO:
14 Yeah. Basically I want to echo the
15 Superintendent's comments today.

16 The City is working hard to
17 strengthen the trust of the community and work
18 on our reforms. Might have heard him tell the
19 progress of the community and the officers
20 within the Englewood district reducing crime
21 and shootings to levels not seen since the late
22 '90s actually.

23 We were successful because of the
24 partnerships we built with the community. Also

1 with technology, smart policing to rid these
2 areas of violence that was controlling these
3 areas.

4 I promise to each one of you that
5 we're going to build upon what we are seeing
6 and continue to drag down crime.

7 Also, I wanted to address some
8 concerning allegations resulting from the
9 State's Attorney's review of criminal cases. I
10 want each of you to know we take these
11 allegations very seriously and if wrongdoing is
12 discovered, officers will be held accountable.
13 That's all. Thank you.

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you, First
15 Deputy Navarro.

16 I will call on members of the
17 public who signed in advance to speak. When
18 your name is called, please step up to the
19 microphone. And, again, we ask you in
20 deference to the folks who have signed up
21 coming behind you to limit your comments to two
22 minutes.

23 First speaker is Ellen Lewis.
24 Ellen Lewis.

1 (NO RESPONSE.)

2 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Next speaker is Ellen
3 Corley. Ellen Corley.

4 (NO RESPONSE.)

5 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is
6 Sarah Ortiz. Ms. Ortiz.

7 (NO RESPONSE.)

8 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is
9 Christa Noel. Ms. Noel.

10 (NO RESPONSE.)

11 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is
12 Pamela Hunt. Ms. Hunt.

13 (NO RESPONSE.)

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Next speaker is Queen
15 Sister. Queen Sister.

16 (NO RESPONSE.)

17 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Our next speaker is
18 Mr. George Blakemore. Mr. Blakemore.

19 MR. BLAKEMORE: Good afternoon to the
20 citizens of the City of Chicago. Police
21 Department has been a problem in our great City
22 for many of years, and the police and the
23 fraternal order and the culture of corruption
24 and the code of silence.

1 Two of my black officers,
2 particular to you, we have advocated for you to
3 get on this force, because we want our black
4 officers to police our community, so I don't
5 want to see our black officers bullied by the
6 white officers.

7 So I had an incident, and I will
8 not go into detail at this time. I will turn
9 the paper over to the lady over here with COPA
10 about the situation.

11 But we want you to look after us.
12 We identify with you culturally, historically.
13 So that code of silence. I've seen the white
14 policeman bully the black police, and the black
15 policeman are silent.

16 Dr. King said silence is
17 betrayal.

18 So on the plantation, the last of
19 names of alphabet will end. When Kunta Kinte
20 decided and surrendered and said my name is
21 Toby, at that moment, a new man was made where
22 the alphabet ends.

23 And we have to purge ourselves,
24 black people, of this holocaust that happened

1 to us.

2 So, again, the very part -- and
3 also I've seen the code that a snake by any
4 other name is still a snake. Do not let the
5 policeman investigate another policeman. And
6 it goes back to the police station with
7 internal affairs. So you can harbor people,
8 not by only whooping them or shooting them, but
9 by being mean spirited and unprofessional.

10 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you,
11 Mr. Blackmore.

12 MR. BLAKEMORE: Thank you very much. And
13 remember, our black policemen, we want you
14 there. We've advocated for you to police our
15 community. Don't be bullied by the white
16 policeman.

17 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you,
18 Mr. Blakemore.

19 MR. BLAKEMORE: This is happening, and it
20 must stop. Remember who you are, where you
21 are, how you got here, enslaved in America.
22 And you're still not free. And we will
23 overcome one day. And thank you, and thank
24 you. And I will give this information to you.

1 And they've been very kind to me at COPA, or
2 whatever new one. Thank you very much. And
3 anyway, God bless each one of you.

4 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Thank you. Our next
5 speaker is Martin Preib.

6 MR. PREIB: I'll pass.

7 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Final speaker is
8 Robert More. Mr. More.

9 MR. MORE: Present. It is November 16th
10 of 2017. And Robert J. More speaking on behalf
11 of the (inaudible) arc angle, executive
12 committee.

13 This is the City of Chicago
14 Police Department -- oops. Got it turned the
15 wrong way.

16 We recognize that this is a
17 global plantation we are on, and this is a
18 component of the enslavement and extermination
19 apparatus. Within that apparatus, we also
20 recognize that there is a fifth column. When
21 the Bolsheviks overran Spain, Franco explained
22 that when we march into Madrid, there will be a
23 fifth column that will join us to take Spain
24 back from the monstrously wicked ancestors of

1 the people who now control this country, as
2 well. So we make that distinction.

3 I've been trying to get a police
4 report -- I have to interrupt the rest of my 24
5 minutes over the course of the year. What's
6 the -- the Superintendent still absent due to
7 health reasons? Is that the reason for his
8 absence, health reasons? I get didn't get an
9 answer.

10 I got to get a police report
11 made. And I got -- the responsibility cannot
12 be delegated. Authority responsibility can't
13 be. So I'm seeking to convene or meet with the
14 supervisor and present this evidence to get a
15 police report made before this escalates into
16 any more hours.

17 The explanation I got, I got a
18 series of 12 demands here in regards to this.
19 It's only a six-page document, maybe eight
20 pages, because it's single-spaced. If I can
21 present this to the Assistant Superintendent
22 because I got to get -- when I come to the
23 table of the City of Chicago, I'm bringing the
24 official misconduct Statute 18-242 with me in

1 every interaction. There is no choice. I've
2 got to lock Lucifer down in every area of the
3 City of Chicago Police Department, up to the
4 C.I.A., up to the Quinones Sanctions, up to the
5 Rothschild to try to fix the problems or die in
6 the process.

7 Can I speak to you, Mr. Assistant
8 Superintendent, and present this evidence to
9 you so that I can get a police report made?
10 And in this interaction, I'm telling you
11 upfront, there's official misconduct risk for
12 not preparing the (inaudible) 18-242. That I
13 can't waive language or forfeit that. So if
14 you're not going to cooperate, then you got to
15 assume whatever risk is assumed. But I got to
16 get names and move up. And also demonstrate to
17 the public the way the members of the public
18 can use this machine to vindicate legitimate
19 reliance interests. Okay? Because that --

20 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thank you,
21 Mr. More.

22 MR. MORE: Thank you.

23 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Before we adjourn, I
24 was remiss earlier in not introducing Judge

1 Patricia Banks who is the interim chief
2 administrator at COPA.

3 Hi, Judge Banks. Thank you for
4 being here. Thank you for stepping up.

5 At this time, all those persons
6 who signed in advance to speak have been
7 recognized. Is there a motion to adjourn?

8 VICE PRESIDENT FOREMAN: So moved.

9 BOARD MEMBER EADDY: Second.

10 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?

11 (CHORUS OF AYES.)

12 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: Any opposed?

13 (NO RESPONSE.)

14 PRESIDENT LIGHTFOOT: The meeting is
15 adjourned. Thank you all. Happy Thanksgiving.

17 proceedings were
18 adjourned at 7:47 p.m.)


