Alderman Reilly asked for the following information:

- A list of companies that DPS utilizes for legal consulting
- A breakdown allocation of legal consulting services and a disparity study
- Provide rental amounts for venues that DPS utilizes for its events

The following firms have previously been engaged for legal consulting:

- Colette Holt and Associates
- Blanchflower Consulting, LLC
- Pugh, Jones and Johnson, P.C.
- Cotillas and Associates

Legal consulting fees have ranged from \$250 to \$350 per hour or can be at a fixed fee for the project. On December 10, 2019, the Department of Law engaged Colette Holt and Associates to do the Disparity Study at a fixed cost of \$880,000.

The amounts for the various venues for DPS events (pricing is based on 2024 estimates):

- UIC Forum \$21,000 (includes room, table chairs, security, audio (mics), parking is not included)
- McCormick Place \$8,237 (room only, equipment or security are a la carte, includes discounted parking)
