Ald. Quinn requested information on how the Chicago Board of Elections could consolidate with the Cook County Clerk's Office

Any potential consolidation would need legislative action with the Illinois State Legislature to change the Illinois Election Code.

Currently, the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners does not have any immediate analysis of the costs or savings to the taxpayers that would result from consolidating election administration into the County Clerk's Office, nor does the Board see any immediate and significant cost-savings to the City of Chicago through this proposed consolidation.

Ald. Taylor requested information on data used to change precincts, how are precincts merged, and the decision-making data about precinct borders.

The Chicago Board of Elections was presented with new ward maps passed by the Chicago City Council on May 16, 2022.

The Chicago Board of Elections was required to draw new precincts by August 31, 2022 ahead of the November 8, 2022 Midterm General Election.

Statutory amendment to Section 11-3 of the Illinois Election Code tripled the target size of election precincts from 600 actual voters to 1,800 registered voters per precinct. (See 10 ILCS 5/11-3(a) and (c).) The Chicago Board of Elections used this statewide mandate to guide the methodology described below. Link to Statute:

A geographic information system (GIS) was originally used to create new precincts from new City ward boundaries based on parameters. GIS consists of integrated computer hardware and software that store, manage, analyze, edit, output, and visualize geographic data.

The Chicago Board of Elections then worked to manually revise the precincts based on following logical criteria:

- Work within the ward boundary and do not split precincts between wards
- Reduce precinct splits created by district boundaries
- Try not to cross expressways, waterways, railroads, major streets, diagonal streets
- Try to form the precinct areas to be uniform in size and shape

After these initial ward and precinct maps were created, the Board then contacted all 50 Alderpeople in Chicago City Council to review those maps and incorporate any ward-specific feedback from Alderpeople in amending the precinct lines, including concerns around senior populations, traditional neighborhood lines, and available accessible polling places.

The Board used this process to create a current total of 1,291 precincts in Chicago, reducing 778 from the previous 2,069 precincts.

The Board reduces precincts after every ten years after a new ward map is passed. For comparison, during the previous redistricting process in 2011, the Chicago Board of Elections reduced its precincts from 2,570 to 2,069, for a total reduction of 501 precincts.

In addition to the above methodology, over the last several election cycles in Chicago, the Board has seen numerous opt-outs from polling places like senior facilities, residential buildings, and storefronts. Precinct polling places on Election Day also rely on a system of thousands of Election Judges who are not as interested to serve as in years past, as evidenced by so many resignations prior to and no-shows on Election Day. As such, each Election Day can be prone to delays in opening polling places and inadequately equipping judges to deal with voters' needs and concerns. Additionally, voter habits have changed in Chicago over the last few elections: over 50% of voters now routinely choose to Early Vote or Vote By Mail in each Chicago election.

Precinct consolidation also allows the Board to train a smaller pool of election judges and coordinators, and for Election Central to provide more support to poll workers' needs and answers to their questions on Election Day. Precinct consolidation allows the Board to continue

The following information is provided in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on December 3, 2024 to discuss the proposed 2025 budget.

Ald. Vasquez requested information on languages and efforts used to promote vote-by-mail; an advertising breakdown and how the city can assist those efforts; and methodology for polling place selection.

The Chicago Board of Elections promotes the use of Vote By Mail/Vote At Home by voters through several channels:

- Two citywide mailings to every registered voter and household with Vote By Mail application information
- Emails to every registered voter with the online application once Vote By Mail applications open and periodic email reminders to non-VBM voters through the application deadline
  - For the November 5, 2024 Presidential Election, it is estimated that over 4.45 million individual emails were sent related to Voting By Mail
- Advertising in publications throughout Chicago, including newspapers, radio, affordable TV stations, and digital & social media (*full list of current vendors included below*)

- Press releases and media interviews with Board spokespeople in English, Spanish, Chinese, Hindi/South Asian, Polish, Korean, and Tagalog publications
- Emails and press releases with community organizations and nonprofits to continue to spread the word

As English and large-scale media publications and stations cover the elections very well, the Board focuses on spending advertising funds in community, local, and non-English publications (approx. 80% of all advertising spending). The Board has also increased its advertising spends with direct service nonprofits to include notices in their digital and website outreach.

The Chicago Board of Elections would be happy to continue to partner with Chicago City Council to promote Vote By Mail as an options for voters. We can increase our proactive communications to ward offices with language and social media graphics, as well as coordinate printing for flyers and door hangers.

Additionally, the Board of Elections would be greatly interested in using existing city communication infrastructure wherever possible, including in recruiting election judges. These communication channels include:

- Citywide digital billboard systems
- Chicago Transit Authority digital and paper billboard systems on public transportation and stations
- City Department and Aldermanic newsletter and mass emails

Generally, precinct polling place selection follows this system:

- Managers of buildings that serve as polling places must sign a contract with the Chicago Board of Elections.
- If the site served as a polling place during the previous election cycle, the Board will work with the site manager to sign on to return as a polling place for the next election. The Board works to ensure as few as polling places changes happen as possible.
- If the previous site can no longer serve or does not wish to serve as a site, alternate locations within the precinct that fit the requirements (enough space, public access, ADA compliant) are sought out, often with the consultation or assistance of the local ward alderperson and committeeperson.
- Wherever possible, the Board will consider public buildings over private buildings for polling places due to cost savings.
