Alderman Taylor asked how many eligible Black applicants are on the 2022 list.

This following information has been provided by the Department of Human Resources to CFD in response to this question.

A total of 15,250 candidates applied to the posting; of that 3,952 identified as Black. Of the 3,952 Black candidates who applied; 1,118 were invited to test based on lottery and preferences. Of the 1,118 Black candidates who were invited to test, 819 Black candidates sat for the test: 297 Black candidates did not show for the test. Of the 819 Black candidates who tested; 393 passed the test 426 Black candidates failed.

DHR has referred a total of 1,000 applicants to OPSA based on lottery and preferences to process thus far; of the 1,000 candidates referred thus far, 183 candidates identify as Black.

There are 1,191 candidates that remain on the eligibility list yet to be referred to OPSA for processing. Of the 1,191 candidates, 204 candidates identify as Black.

Alderman Nugent asked for the consequences of encampments using propane tanks.

CFD is aware of the hazards caused by propane tanks as well as the safety measures that are in place.

CFD has not encountered any catastrophic failures of propane tanks used in homeless encampments. The industry has taken several measures to ensure propane tanks are safe. Propane tanks in an encampment have no greater danger than ones used in backyard grills, in industrial settings, parking lots during tailgating parties at sporting events, or the numerous food trucks that travel through City limits daily. What is encountered in encampments are primarily caused by human action. If combustibles ignite because of careless use or unattended heat producing appliances fueled by propone gas, CFD responds and mitigates the incident as we do for any fire. CFD has taken extra measures that the Office of Fire Investigation responds to these incidents to document and make notifications to OEMC who notify various city departments for inspection and clean-up.

Alderman Sigcho Lopez asked how many eligible Latinx applicants are on the 2022 list.

This following information has been provided by the Office of Public Safety Administration.

A total of 15,250 candidates applied to the posting; of that 4,928 identified as Hispanic. Of the 4,928 Hispanic candidates who applied; 2,034 were invited to test based on lottery and preferences. Of the 2,034 Hispanic candidates who were invited to test, 1,714 Hispanic candidates sat for the test: 311 Hispanic candidates did not show for the test. Of the 1,714 Hispanic candidates who tested; 869 passed the test and 845 failed.

DHR has referred a total of 1,000 applicants to OPSA based on lottery and preferences to process thus far; Of the 1,000 candidates referred thus far, 316 candidates identify as Hispanic/Latinx. There are 1,191 candidates that remain on the eligibility list yet to be referred to OPSA for processing. Of the 1,191 candidates, 530 candidates identify as Hispanic.
