

### Migration Patterns to the US Border


New Arrivals to Chicago hail mainly from South American and Central American Countries






### Migration Patterns to Democratic Cities from the Border

20 shelters in operation across the city



## **TPS/EAD & Workforce Development**

The Resurrection Project and the State — in collaboration with City and Federal governments, and others — are coordinating efforts to **centralize and expedite application** preparation via large-scale workshops for new arrivals who are eligible for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) and/or Employment Authorization Documents (EAD).



# **Measles Update**

- CDPH has confirmed 61 cases of measles associated with Chicago residents to date, only 7 of which have been confirmed within the last two weeks.
- The majority of cases have been found in children under the age of 5,
   underscoring the importance of childhood vaccination.
- Over 6,700 new arrivals have received at least one MMR vaccine since the beginning of March and many of those have now also received their second dose as well.



### **Park Districts**

- Beginning March 30, 2024, decompression of temporary shelters in Park facilities began and will continue in phases:
  - Leone Park Boathouse
  - Piotrowski Park
  - Broadway Armory
  - Gage Park
  - Brands Park
- Shelter residents will be transported to new shelter locations, prioritizing relocation to the shelters closest to them.
- Children are expected to remain in the same school during and after the transition. CPS will provide support.
- Park facilities will be restored so that park programming and other park operations can resume in time for summer.





### St. Bartholomew Church

- New family shelter at St. Bartholomew Catholic Church.
- Collaborative effort between the City of Chicago, Cook County, the Archdiocese of Chicago, and the Zakat Foundation.
- Under this partnership, the Archdiocese of Chicago is leasing St. Bart's to the City of Chicago at no cost.
- The City is subleasing the property to the Zakat Foundation who will assume all operational costs including logistics and staffing.
- Cook County is overseeing necessary renovations, with the shelter set to open in mid-April













### **Federal Government Advocacy**













#### **ASKS**

- Federal funding and flexibility in use of such funding for sheltering operations and overall expenses
- Nationwide coordination of resettlement to receiving cities/States with a single federal leader
- Resources and technical assistance for expedited
   Temporary Protective Status (TPS) and employment authorization document (EAD) processing
- Expansion of TPS and EAD for all non-citizens
- Funding for CPS, CDPH and other City agencies most impacted

#### HERE TO WORK CAMPAIGN

Mayor Brandon Johnson joined ABIC, TRP, and dozens of immigration, labor, non-profit, faith, and business leaders to urge our federal government to leverage its authority to grant work authorization for long-term undocumented immigrants and our most recent arrivals.
